The study findings suggest that the utilization of postnatal care (PNC) services is generally higher among older women, the literate women, those who efficiently utilize antenatal care (ANC) services, and those who have a perceived high risk of a wound from their cesarean sections.

Factors associated with the utilization of postnatal care ...

Postnatal care services utilization was 73.7% and 61.4% in the urban and rural settlements respectively. Multivariate analysis identified antenatal attendance, large baby, poorest wealth quintile, transportation problems to the health facilities, and maternal age as predictors of postnatal care services utilization in the urban settings.

Approximately 20-40% of direct maternal deaths in Africa are due to hemorrhage, mostly in the postpartum period both in the hospital and in the community levels. In sub Saharan Africa only 13 % of the mothers attend postnatal care .Adequate

Educational status, women's autonomy, number of pregnancy, place of delivery and knowledge of postpartum obstetric danger sign were the factors making a difference in utilizing post natal care service. Thus, strengthening the provision of information, education and communication (IEC) was recommended.

Evidence showed that PNC services utilization is influenced by factors such as; maternal age, educational level of the women, occupational status of women and husbands, place of delivery, mode of delivery, the number of pregnancies, awareness about obstetric related danger sign, and awareness about PNC services [7-21].

Postnatal care utilization and associated factors among ...

Multivariate analysis showed that mother's age at delivery, residence, education, antenatal care, place of delivery, wealth, husband's occupation, husband's concern about pregnancy complications and mother's permission to go to a health centre alone were likely to affect utilisation of postpartum care services.

Utilization of Postnatal Care and Its Determinants

While factors such as wealth quintile, media exposure and rural/urban residence were commonly adjudged as significant, education of the adolescent mother and her partner were the commonest significant factors that influenced MHS utilisation. Use of antenatal care also predicted use of skilled birth attendance and use of both predicted use of postnatal care.

Factors affecting the utilisation of postnatal services ...

Several studies conducted in different countries on demographic and socio-cultural factors influencing use of maternal health care services, have shown that factors like maternal age, number of living children, education, place of residence, occupation, religion and ethnicity are significantly associated with use of antenatal care.

Its was found that most women lacked awareness about the services given in postnatal clinic and long waiting time and cultural beliefs were among factors that affected utilization of postnatal care. From the study the utilization of the postnatal services at the hospital in 14.2% which is quite low considering the need for postnatal services.
